REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
Monday, November 7, 2022

The City Council met with the Library Board at 5:30 for an electronic sign demonstration with Tharp Design and Think Sign and to ask questions.

The regular meeting of the Garrison City Council was held Monday November 7, 2022, at 6 pm. The meeting was held at the Garrison Public Library. Mayor Flickinger presided. Council members present: Al Lindsey, Marvin Trimble, Robert Decker, and Doug Kearns. Absent: Tina Rommann. City Clerk, Angela Dague recorded the minutes.

 - Public Safety – October report very minimal

 - Maintenance/Roads – Potholes were being filled. Equipment should be moved to the shop so they can be worked on this winter. Chipper steering columns are getting fixed.
 - Public Works – Sewer lining is done, lagoon discharge is being done, one of the new valves has been put on.
 - BC Development – no report
 - Park – Ash trees in park are going to be cut down.
 - Library – concert Nov. 13 @ 2, Soup with Santa will be December 15, working on fund raising for new sign.
 - Fire Dept. – Garrison’s Haunted is over and successful. Auxiliary wants to purchase new poles for flags.
 - Administrative – Garrison has qualified for the Offset Program; Clerk will attend budget workshop at end of November.
- Old Business
 - Discussion on dividing the town into thirds, getting a map and plan. We will send a letter to residents prior to pursuing junk and junk vehicle nuisances in town.

- New Business:
 - Discussion meter purchase payback
 - Trimble moved to pursue a \$6 increase for 3.5 years to pay back the meter purchase, seconded by Kearns. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.
 - Discussion on putting marker flags on some culverts and hydrants before snow comes
 - Councilman Lindsey shared information about other communities and what they are doing about animal control.
 - Code meeting is set for November 21 @ 6
 - Budget work session is set for January 16, 2023 @6.

Trimble moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Decker. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried. There being no further business before council, Mayor Flickinger adjourned the meeting at 7:28 pm.
