REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
Monday, June 5, 2023

The regular meeting of the Garrison City Council was held Monday June 5, 2023, at 6 pm. The meeting was held at the Garrison Public Library. Mayor Flickinger presided. Council members present: Tina Rommann, Al Lindsey, Marvin Trimble, Robert Decker, and Doug Kearns. City Clerk, Angela Dague recorded the minutes.

- Kearns moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Trimble. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.
- Decker moved to approve the consent agenda, seconded by Rommann. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

- Rick Rommann – building permit
 - Lindsey made a motion to approve Rommann’s building permit for a shed addition, seconded by Trimble. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried.

- Public Comment – Jim Kearns notified Council that a culvert on his property needs cleaned or replaced, possibly expanded.

 - Public Works – Trees were taken down and burned on lagoon’s east side. Rest of pile will be moved off of CRP areas. Fence will be replaced, grass seed will be needed, county will fix ditch outside of lagoon.

 - Fire Dept. – a helicopter will be at the park on Monday, June 12th.
 - Library – Concert on June 11 @2, kids lunches are now being served at the library, summer program will start June 19
 - Sesquicentennial – VS cheerleaders have volunteered to help with games. Trimble shared the schedule for the Sesquicentennial on July 7 & 8.

 - Rommann moved to approve the Utility Billing Policy and Procedure, seconded by Lindsey. Ayes: Rommann, Lindsey, Trimble, Decker. Nays: Kearns. Motion carried.
 - Discussion on what procedure to take for complaints on loose chickens and a dog. A warning letter will be sent.
 - Code meeting will be June 19 @ 6 pm.

Rommann moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Decker. Ayes: All. Nays: None. Motion carried. There being no further business before council, Mayor Flickinger adjourned the meeting at 7:26 pm.
